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About Lauren Granite and Centropa

Lauren B. Granite, Centropa's U.S. Education Director, has a doctorate in the Sociology of Religion from Drew University. She received her Master of Philosophy Degree in Religious Studies from The University of Chicago, and her Bachelor of Arts Degree from New York University. Lauren brings to Centropa fifteen years of experience educating students in universities and colleges, high school, congregational schools and adult education settings. In these varied educational institutions, she created and taught courses in Jewish history (ancient, medieval, modern, Holocaust, Israel), women in Judaism, comparative religions, diaspora Jewish communities, and Jewish culture.

Centropa interviewed more than 1200 Holocaust survivors in Central Europe from 2000-2008. They did not videotape the interviews, but rather asked survivors to tell about their lives by showing family photographs. This means they focused on how they lived, not how they or their relatives suffered or died. Centropa then created short multi-media films of the most compelling stories – how people fell in love, where they went on vacation, what happened to them after the war. Teachers can find the interviews, over 22,000 family photographs and over 30 short multimedia films at www.centropa.org, in addition to a web page of student video projects from the US, Europe and Israel, and online classroom tested lessons.
